Management Discussion of Fund Performance

Results of Operations

Renaissance Emerging Markets Fund's (the *Fund*) portfolio sub-advisor is Victory Capital Management Inc. (the *Sub-Advisor*). The commentary that follows provides a summary of the results of operations for the sixmonth period ended February 28, 2025. All dollar figures are expressed in thousands, unless otherwise indicated.

The Fund's net asset value decreased by 7% during the period, from \$11,571 as at August 31, 2024 to \$10,787 as at February 28, 2025. Net redemptions of \$1,518 were partially offset by positive investment performance, resulting in an overall decrease in net asset value.

Class A units of the Fund posted a return of 6.1% for the period. The Fund's benchmark, the MSCI Emerging Markets Index (the *benchmark*), returned 7.6% for the same period. The Fund's return is after the deduction of fees and expenses, unlike the benchmark's return. See the section *Past Performance* for the returns of other classes of units offered by the Fund.

Globally diverging inflation and therefore monetary policy impacted markets, driven more by domestic conditions rather than large global shocks. Geopolitical risk was heightened, with both active conflicts and simmering trade tensions a central concern.

In China, consumer and business confidence remained depressed and labour and housing markets weak, while deflationary pressures persisted. In Europe, the Middle East and Africa, as well as in Latin America, fiscal and monetary policy diverged.

In mid-January 2025, the new U.S. administration released a significant number of policy announcements leading to an increase in policy uncertainty regarding tariffs and immigration.

Stock selection in the financials and consumer discretionary sectors detracted from the Fund's performance. Exposure to China detracted from performance, driven by stock selection and the Fund's defensive positioning. Overweight holdings in LG Innotek Co. Ltd., Hero MotoCorp Ltd. and PT Bank Rakyat Indonesia (Persero) TBK (*Bank BRI*) were the largest individual detractors from performance.

LG Innotek Co. Ltd. reported weaker quarterly earnings results, impacted by unfavourable foreign exchange and sluggish demand for

front-end industries. Hero MotoCorp Ltd. beat quarterly earnings expectations, but its volumes came under pressure in November and December amid a weaker consumption backdrop. Bank BRI's profitability was negatively impacted by weaker net interest margins and higher loan provisions.

Stock selection in the industrials and materials sectors contributed to the Fund's performance. Within industrials, to which the Fund held an overweight exposure, many companies benefited from increasing military spending or from company-specific fundamental strength. In materials, a slight underweight allocation contributed to performance. Stock selection within India also contributed to performance, as did an underweight allocation to the country. India's equity market was affected by a weak earnings season as a result of a cyclical slowdown.

Overweight holdings in Emaar Properties PJSC and Range Intelligent Computing Technology Group Co. Ltd. contributed to performance. Emaar Properties PJSC formalized its dividend policy during the period, committing to a share payout for 2024–2027 that was more than double the market consensus estimate. Range Intelligent Computing Technology Group Co. Ltd. benefited from a ramp-up in cloudcomputing services, as well as surging demand for artificial intelligence data centre capacity and energy consumption.

An underweight holding in Reliance Industries Ltd. was another notable contributor to performance. The company has consistently reported weaker value and profitability relative to its energy peers and is exposed to declining regional refinery margins.

The Sub-Advisor added to the Fund new holdings in Xiaomi Corp., NetEase Inc. and Bank BRI during the period. Xiaomi Corp. was added for its net income, which should grow by more than 20% year over year in 2025 and 2026, supported by its product mix and the expansion of its electric vehicle business.

NetEase Inc. was added based on the expectation that its overseas market should increase over the next few years. The company is placing an emphasis on expanding overseas gaming activity and developing strategic partnerships with global studios. Bank BRI was added based on the Sub-Advisor's belief that the company's return on assets should improve. The company is the main beneficiary of interest rate cuts given that 80% of its loan book is fixed.

Existing Fund holdings in Alibaba Group Holding Ltd. and Grupo Financiero Banorte SAB de CV (*Banorte*) were increased. Alibaba Group Holding Ltd. was increased based on improving margins and shareholder returns. Its management has communicated the company's increased focus on quality, service and then price. Banorte was increased as the Sub-Advisor believes it to be well positioned for a decline in interest rates.

A holding in Pinduoduo Inc. was eliminated from the Fund following a sharp decline in the company's stock based on lower forecasts and a lack of shareholder returns. A holding in Saudi Telecom Co. was sold as the Sub-Advisor does not find the company's valuation versus expected growth rate compelling. A holding in Shandong Nanshan Aluminium Co. Ltd. was eliminated from the Fund because of the potential for tariffs to put pressure on the company in 2025.

A holding in Samsung Electronics Co. Ltd. was trimmed. Sentiment deteriorated as the company continued to struggle with its foundry division and with the ramp-up of high bandwidth memory, which makes the company more vulnerable to weakness in consumer tech.

The Fund's higher portfolio turnover rate during the period can be attributed to portfolio repositioning in response to recent volatility.

Recent Developments

Effective March 14, 2025, Mackenzie Financial Corporation replaced Victory Capital Management Inc. as portfolio sub-advisor of the Fund.

The level of geopolitical risk disrupted the global economy and financial markets in unprecedented and unpredictable ways. Threatened and actual impositions of tariffs and other trade-related actions by the U.S., China and other global actors, and any counter-tariff and non-tariff retaliatory measures by Canada, Europe and others, may have further negative impacts on the Canadian and global economy, and on financial markets. These events could exacerbate other preexisting political, social and economic risks and cause substantial market volatility and uncertainty in financial markets. It is unclear what further actions may be taken by governments and the resulting impact on global economies, businesses and financial markets. These factors may adversely affect the Fund's performance. The Manager continues to monitor ongoing developments and the impact to investment strategies.

Related Party Transactions

Canadian Imperial Bank of Commerce (*CIBC*) and its affiliates have the following roles and responsibilities with respect to the Fund, and receive the fees described below in connection with their roles and responsibilities.

Manager, Trustee, and Portfolio Advisor of the Fund

CAMI, a wholly-owned subsidiary of CIBC, is the Fund's Manager, Trustee, and Portfolio Advisor. As Manager, CAMI receives management fees with respect to the Fund's day-to-day business and operations, calculated based on the net asset value of each respective class of units of the Fund as described in *Management Fees*.

The Manager pays the Fund's operating expenses (other than certain fund costs) in respect of the classes of units of the Fund (except Class O unit), which may include but are not limited to, operating and

administrative costs; regulatory fees; audit, and legal fees and expenses; trustee, safekeeping, custodial, and any agency fees; and investor servicing costs and costs of unitholder reports, prospectuses, Fund Facts, and other reports, in exchange for the Fund paying a fixed rate administration fee (plus applicable GST/HST) to the Manager with respect to those classes of units. For Class O units, no fixed administration fee will be charged. The Manager pays the Fund's operating expenses (other than certain Fund costs) allocated to Class O units of the Fund. The fixed administration fee payable by the Fund, may, in any particular period, exceed or be lower than the expenses we incur in providing such services to the Fund.

As Trustee, CAMI holds title to the Fund's property (cash and securities) on behalf of its unitholders. As Portfolio Advisor, CAMI provides, or arranges to provide investment advice and portfolio management services to the Fund. CAMI also compensates dealers in connection with their marketing activities regarding the Fund. From time to time, CAMI may invest in units of the Fund.

Distributor

Dealers and other firms sell units of the Fund to investors. These dealers and other firms include CAMI's related dealers such as the CIBC Investor's Edge discount brokerage division of CIBC Investor Services Inc. (*CIBC ISI*), the CIBC Imperial Service division of CIBC ISI, and the CIBC Wood Gundy division of CIBC World Markets Inc. (*CIBC WM*). CIBC ISI and CIBC WM are wholly-owned subsidiaries of CIBC.

CAMI may pay sales commissions and trailing commissions to these dealers and firms in connection with the sale of units of the Fund. These dealers and other firms may pay a portion of these sales commissions and trailing commissions to their advisors who sell units of the Fund to investors.

Brokerage Arrangements and Soft Dollars

The Portfolio Advisor or any portfolio sub-advisors make decisions, including the selection of markets and dealers and the negotiation of commissions, with respect to the purchase and sale of portfolio securities, certain derivative products and the execution of portfolio transactions. Brokerage business may be allocated by the Portfolio Advisor or any portfolio sub-advisor(s) to CIBC WM and CIBC World Markets Corp., each a subsidiary of CIBC. CIBC WM and CIBC World Markets Corp. may also earn spreads on the sale of fixed income securities, other securities, and certain derivative products to the Fund. A spread is the difference between the bid and ask prices for a security in the applicable marketplace, with respect to the execution of portfolio transactions. The spread will differ based upon various factors such as the nature and liquidity of the security.

Dealers, including CIBC WM and CIBC World Markets Corp., may furnish goods and services, other than order execution, to the Portfolio Advisor or any portfolio sub-advisor(s) when they process trades through them. These types of goods and services for which the Portfolio Advisor or a portfolio sub-advisor may direct brokerage commissions are research goods and services and order execution goods and services, and are referred to in the industry as "soft-dollar" arrangements. These goods and services received through soft dollar arrangements assist the Portfolio Advisor or any portfolio sub-advisor(s) with investment decision-making services for the Fund, or relate directly to the execution of portfolio transactions on behalf of the Fund. As per the terms of the portfolio advisory agreement and portfolio sub-advisory agreements, such soft dollar arrangements are in compliance with applicable laws.

During the period, the Fund did not pay any brokerage commissions or other fees to CIBC WM or CIBC World Markets Corp. Spreads associated with fixed income and other securities are not ascertainable and, for that reason, cannot be included when determining these amounts.

Fund Transactions

The Fund may enter into one or more of the following transactions (the *Related Party Transactions*) in reliance on the standing instructions issued by the Independent Review Committee (the *IRC*):

- invest in or hold equity securities of CIBC or issuers related to a portfolio sub-advisor;
- invest in or hold non-exchange-traded debt securities of CIBC or an issuer related to CIBC, with terms-to-maturity of 365 days or more, issued in a primary offering and in the secondary market;
- make an investment in the securities of an issuer for which CIBC WM, CIBC World Markets Corp., or any affiliate of CIBC (a *Related Dealer* or the *Related Dealers*) acts as an underwriter during the offering of the securities or at any time during the 60-day period following the completion of the offering of such securities (in the case of a "private placement" offering, in accordance with the Private Placement Relief Order and the policies and procedures relating to such investment);
- purchase equity or debt securities from, or sell them to, a Related Dealer, where it is acting as principal;
- undertake currency and currency derivative transactions where a related party is the counterparty;
- purchase securities from or sell securities to another investment fund or a managed account managed by the Manager or an affiliate (*inter-fund trades* or *cross-trades*); and
- engage in in-specie transfers by receiving portfolio securities from, or delivering portfolio securities to, a managed account or another investment fund managed by the Manager or an affiliate, in respect of a purchase or redemption of units of the Fund, subject to certain conditions.

At least annually, the IRC reviews the Related Party Transactions for which they have issued standing instructions. The IRC is required to advise the Canadian securities regulatory authorities, after a matter has been referred to or reported to it by the Manager, if it determines that an investment decision was not made in accordance with conditions imposed by securities legislation or the IRC in any Related Party Transactions requiring its approval.

Custodian

CIBC Mellon Trust Company is the custodian of the Fund (the *Custodian*). The Custodian holds cash and securities for the Fund and ensures that those assets are kept separate from any other cash or securities that the Custodian might be holding. The Custodian also provides other services to the Fund including record-keeping and processing of foreign exchange transactions. The fees and spreads for

the services of the Custodian are paid by the Manager in exchange for the Fund charging a Fixed Administration Fee. CIBC owns a 50% interest in the Custodian.

Service Provider

The Custodian also provides certain services to the Fund, including securities lending, fund accounting and reporting, and portfolio valuation. The Manager receives fixed administration fee from the Fund, in return, the Manager pays certain operating expenses which includes custodial fees (including all applicable taxes) and the fees for fund accounting, reporting, and fund valuation (including all applicable taxes) to the Custodian. Where applicable, securities lending fees are applied against the revenue received by the Fund.

⁶ The decision to waive management fees and/or fixed administration fees is at the discretion of the Manager. The practice of waiving management fees and/or fixed administration fees may continue indefinitely or may be terminated at any time without notice to unitholders. The management expense ratio before waivers or absorptions includes the fees attributable to exchange traded funds, where applicable.

⁷ The trading expense ratio represents total commissions and other portfolio transaction costs before income taxes expressed as an annualized percentage of the daily average net asset value during the period. Spreads associated with fixed income securities trading are not ascertainable and, for that reason, are not included in the trading expense ratio calculation. Previously, the trading expense ratio included the fees attributable to exchange traded funds which are now no longer included in the TER. Prior year fees attributable to exchange traded funds have been reclassified to the management expense ratio and management expense ratio before waivers or absorptions.

⁸ The portfolio turnover rate indicates how actively the portfolio advisor and/or portfolio sub-advisor manages the portfolio investments. A portfolio turnover rate of 100% is equivalent to a fund buying and selling all of the securities in its portfolio once in the course of the period. The higher a portfolio turnover rate in a period, the greater the trading costs payable by a fund in the period, and the greater the chance of an investor receiving taxable capital gains in the year. There is not necessarily a relationship between a high turnover rate and the performance of a fund.

Management Fees

The Fund pays CAMI an annual management fee to cover the costs of managing the Fund. Management fees are based on the Fund's net asset value and are calculated daily and paid monthly. Management fees are paid to CAMI in consideration for providing, or arranging for the provision of, management, distribution, and portfolio advisory services. Advertising and promotional expenses, office overhead expenses, trailing commissions, and the fees of the portfolio sub-advisor are paid by CAMI out of the management fees received from the Fund. The Fund is required to pay applicable taxes on the management fees paid to CAMI. Refer to the simplified prospectus for the annual management fee rate for each class of units.

For Class O units, the management fee is negotiated with and paid by, or as directed by, unitholders or dealers and discretionary managers on behalf of unitholders. Such Class O management fee will not exceed the Class F unit management fee rate.








Year-by-Year Returns
