Management Discussion of Fund Performance

Results of Operations

Renaissance Floating Rate Income Fund's (referred to as the *Fund*) portfolio Sub-Advisor is Ares Capital Management II LLC (referred to as the *Sub-Advisor*). The commentary that follows provides a summary of the results of operations for the six-month period ended February 28, 2022. All dollar figures are expressed in thousands, unless otherwise indicated.

The Fund's net asset value increased by 6% during the period, from \$627,771 as at August 31, 2021 to \$667,020 as at February 28, 2022. Net sales of \$34,178 and positive investment performance resulted in an overall increase in net asset value.

Class A units of the Fund posted a return of 0.6% for the period. The Fund's benchmark, the Credit Suisse Leveraged Loan Index (referred to as the *benchmark*), returned 1.6% for the same period. The Fund's return is after the deduction of fees and expenses, unlike the benchmark's return. See the section *Past Performance* for the returns of other classes of units offered by the Fund.

The COVID-19 pandemic continued to be a major influence on the global economy and financial markets during the period. With the emergence of COVID-19 vaccines, global financial markets reopened, supporting above-trend growth and inflation. This also caused interest rates to rise throughout 2021. With vaccination campaigns that were relatively successful (depending on the country), each successive wave of infection proved to have less impact on economic activity.

After a strong recovery driven by the reopening of economies, the momentum of economic growth began to wane. Growth remained robust but was no longer improving. At the same time, inflation rose. Some of the high inflation can be attributed to an easy comparison to prices that were depressed the previous year. There were also supply bottlenecks that pushed up prices higher in many industries.

The Chinese economic cycle slowed as the sentiment toward credit turned negative. The unexpected development that amplified the slowdown was the tightening of regulations for the information technology and real estate sectors. There were signs that the effects of policy tightening reached their highest "pain threshold." As a result,

Chinese leadership is expected to take some action to support the economy.

Geopolitical tensions in Ukraine grew as Russia built up its military presence around the country. Ultimately, Russia began a military invasion of Ukraine, which was answered with severe economic and financial sanctions from the West. Commodity prices rose significantly.

In the latter half of 2021, yield curves flattened as short-term bond yields rose sharply. Investors were adjusting to the U.S. Federal Reserve Board and other global central banks setting the stage for interest rate increases in 2022. However, long-term yields fell in the fourth quarter of 2021. The uncertainty of the extent of central bank actions, coupled with the Russia-Ukraine conflict, saw credit spreads (the yield differential between securities of similar maturity but differing credit quality) rise in early 2022. In addition, sectors posted negative returns.

The Fund's mandated requirement of a 15% allocation to high-yield bonds detracted from performance as interest rates rose. A holding in Diamond Sports Group LLC detracted from the Fund's performance as the company was negatively affected by ongoing negotiations with management and uncertainty regarding its liquidity position. Envision Healthcare Corp. was another detractor from the Fund's performance after the announcement of new billing legislation that could have a negative impact on the company's margins.

Security selection within the Fund's bank loan allocation contributed to its performance. A holding in Equinox Holdings Inc. contributed to performance. The gym operator benefited from businesses reopening as pandemic-related shutdowns eased. The Fund's holding in AVSC Holding Corp. was another contributor to the Fund's performance. It also benefited from reopening businesses, and from business conferences returning to normal practice.

The Sub-Advisor increased the Fund's second-lien holdings in light of the rebound in riskier assets.

The Fund's lower portfolio turnover rate can be attributed to smaller opportunity on set of new loan issuances versus prior years.

Recent Developments

The escalating conflict between Ukraine and the Russian Federation has resulted in significant volatility and uncertainty in financial markets. It is unclear what further actions may be taken by governments and the resulting impact on global economies, businesses, financial markets, and the Fund's performance. While the situation remains fluid, the Fund continues to monitor ongoing developments and the impact to investment strategies.

Effective December 1, 2021, the annual management fee was reduced from 1.50% to 1.25% and the maximum annual trailing commission was reduced from 0.75% to 0.50% for Class A and Class H units of the Fund.

Effective September 1, 2021, CAMI, as Manager, pays the Fund's operating expenses, other than certain expenses, in exchange for the payment by the Fund of a fixed administration fee. This fee applies to all of the Fund's classes, other than Class O and Class OH, and is equal to a specified percentage of the net asset value of each class of the Fund.

The COVID-19 pandemic and the restrictions imposed by governments around the world to limit its spread have disrupted the global economy and financial markets in unprecedented and unpredictable ways. The COVID-19 outbreak may adversely affect the performance of the Fund.

Related Party Transactions

Canadian Imperial Bank of Commerce (referred to as *CIBC*) and its affiliates have the following roles and responsibilities with respect to the Fund, and receive the fees described below in connection with their roles and responsibilities.

Manager, Trustee, and Portfolio Advisor of the Fund

CAMI, a wholly-owned subsidiary of CIBC, is the Fund's Manager, Trustee, and Portfolio Advisor. As Manager, CAMI receives management fees with respect to the Fund's day-to-day business and operations, calculated based on the net asset value of each respective class of units of the Fund as described in *Management Fees*.

The Manager pays the Fund's operating expenses (other than certain Fund costs) in respect of the classes of units of the Fund (except Class O unit), which may include but are not limited to, operating and administrative costs; regulatory fees; audit, and legal fees and expenses; trustee, safekeeping, custodial, and any agency fees; and investor servicing costs and costs of unitholder reports, prospectuses, Fund Facts, and other reports, in exchange for the Fund paying a fixed rate administration fee (plus applicable GST/HST) to the Manager with respect to those classes of units. For Class O units, no fixed administration fee will be charged. The Manager pays the Fund's operating expenses (other than certain Fund costs) allocated to Class O units of the Fund. The fixed administration fee payable by the Fund, may, in any particular period, exceed or be lower than the expenses we incur in providing such services to the Fund.

As Trustee, CAMI holds title to the Fund's property (cash and securities) on behalf of its unitholders. As Portfolio Advisor, CAMI provides, or arranges to provide for, investment advice and portfolio management services to the Fund. CAMI also compensates dealers in

connection with their marketing activities regarding the Fund. From time to time, CAMI may invest in units of the Fund.

Distributor

Dealers and other firms sell units of the Fund to investors. These dealers and other firms include CAMI's related dealers such as the CIBC Investor's Edge discount brokerage division of CIBC Investor Services Inc. (referred to as *CIBC ISI*), the CIBC Imperial Service division of CIBC ISI, and the CIBC Wood Gundy division of CIBC World Markets Inc. (referred to as *CIBC WM*). CIBC ISI and CIBC WM are wholly-owned subsidiaries of CIBC.

CAMI may pay sales commissions and trailing commissions to these dealers and firms in connection with the sale of units of the Fund. These dealers and other firms may pay a portion of these sales commissions and trailing commissions to their advisors who sell units of the Fund to investors.

Brokerage Arrangements and Soft Dollars

CAMI generally delegates trading and execution authority to the portfolio sub-advisors and does not, in its capacity as portfolio advisor, receive any goods or services directly through soft dollar arrangements.

The Portfolio Advisor and any portfolio sub-advisors make decisions, including the selection of markets and dealers and the negotiation of commissions, with respect to the purchase and sale of portfolio securities, certain derivative products and the execution of portfolio transactions. Brokerage business may be allocated by the Portfolio Advisor and any portfolio sub-advisor to CIBC WM and CIBC World Markets Corp., each a subsidiary of CIBC. CIBC WM and CIBC World Markets Corp. may also earn spreads on the sale of fixed income securities, other securities, and certain derivative products to the Fund. A spread is the difference between the bid and ask prices for a security in the applicable marketplace, with respect to the execution of portfolio transactions. The spread will differ based upon various factors such as the nature and liquidity of the security.

Dealers, including CIBC WM and CIBC World Markets Corp., may furnish goods and services, other than order execution, to the Portfolio Advisor and any portfolio sub-advisors when they process trades through them (referred to in the industry as "soft-dollar" arrangements). These goods and services are paid for with a portion of the brokerage commissions and assist the Portfolio Advisor and any portfolio sub-advisor with investment decision-making services for the Fund or relate directly to the execution of portfolio transactions on behalf of the Fund. As per the terms of the portfolio sub-advisory agreements, such soft dollar arrangements are in compliance with applicable laws.

In addition, the Manager may enter into commission recapture arrangements with certain dealers with respect to the Fund. Any commission recaptured will be paid to the Fund.

During the period, the Fund did not pay any brokerage commissions or other fees to CIBC WM or CIBC World Markets Corp. Spreads associated with fixed income and other securities are not ascertainable and, for that reason, cannot be included when determining these amounts.

Fund Transactions

The Fund may enter into one or more of the following transactions (referred to as the *Related Party Transactions*) in reliance on the standing instructions issued by the Independent Review Committee (referred to as referred to as the *IRC*):

- invest in or hold equity securities of CIBC or issuers related to a portfolio sub-advisor;
- invest in or hold non-exchange-traded debt securities of CIBC or an issuer related to CIBC, with terms-to-maturity of 365 days or more, issued in a primary offering and in the secondary market;
- make an investment in the securities of an issuer for which CIBC WM, CIBC World Markets Corp., or any affiliate of CIBC (referred to as a *Related Dealer* or the *Related Dealers*) acts as an underwriter during the offering of the securities or at any time during the 60-day period following the completion of the offering of such securities (in the case of a “private placement” offering, in accordance with the Private Placement Relief Order and the policies and procedures relating to such investment);
- purchase equity or debt securities from, or sell them to, a Related Dealer, where it is acting as principal;
- undertake currency and currency derivative transactions where a related party is the counterparty;
- purchase securities from or sell securities to another investment fund or a managed account managed by the Manager or an affiliate (referred to as *inter-fund trades* or *cross-trades*); and
- engage in in-specie transfers by receiving portfolio securities from, or delivering portfolio securities to, a managed account or another investment fund managed by the Manager or an affiliate, in respect of a purchase or redemption of units of the Fund, subject to certain conditions.

At least annually, the IRC reviews the Related Party Transactions for which they have issued standing instructions. The IRC is required to advise the Canadian securities regulatory authorities, after a matter has been referred to or reported to it by the Manager, if it determines that an investment decision was not made in accordance with conditions imposed by securities legislation or the IRC in any Related Party Transactions requiring its approval.

Custodian

CIBC Mellon Trust Company is the custodian of the Fund (referred to as the *Custodian*). The Custodian holds all cash and securities for the Fund and ensures that those assets are kept separate from any other cash or securities that the custodian might be holding. The Custodian also provides other services to the Fund including record-keeping and processing of foreign exchange transactions. The fees and spreads for services of the Custodian directly related to the execution of portfolio transactions by the Fund are paid by CAMI and/or dealer(s) directed by CAMI, up to the amount of the credits generated under soft dollar arrangements from trading on behalf of the Fund during that month. All other fees and spreads for the services of the Custodian are paid by the Manager. CIBC owns a 50% interest in the Custodian.

Service Provider

CIBC Mellon Global Securities Services Company (referred to as *CIBC GSS*) provides certain services to the Fund, including securities lending, fund accounting and reporting, and portfolio valuation. Such servicing fees are paid by the Manager. CIBC indirectly owns a 50% interest in CIBC GSS.

Management Fees

The Fund pays CAMI an annual management fee to cover the costs of managing the Fund. Management fees are based on the Fund's net asset value and are calculated daily and paid monthly. Management fees are paid to CAMI in consideration for providing, or arranging for the provision of, management, distribution, and portfolio advisory services. Advertising and promotional expenses, office overhead expenses, trailing commissions, and the fees of the portfolio sub-advisor are paid by CAMI out of the management fees received from the Fund. The Fund is required to pay applicable taxes on the management fees paid to CAMI. Refer to the simplified prospectus for the annual management fee rate for each class of units.

For Class O and Class OH units, the management fee is negotiated with and paid by, or as directed by, unitholders or dealers and discretionary managers on behalf of unitholders. Such management fee for Class O and Class OH units will not exceed the annual management fee rate for Class F and Class FH units respectively.

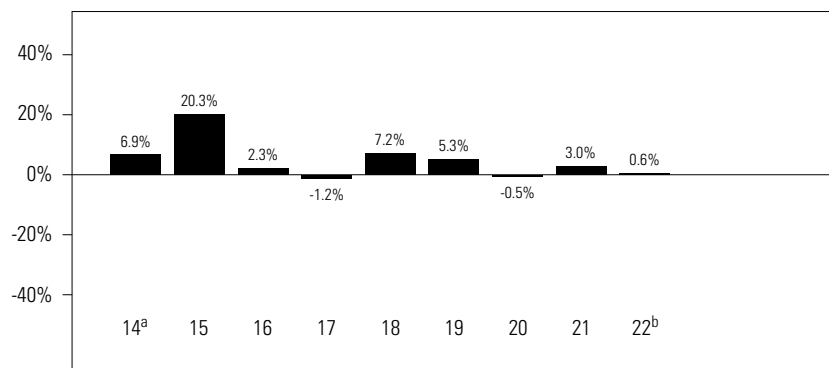

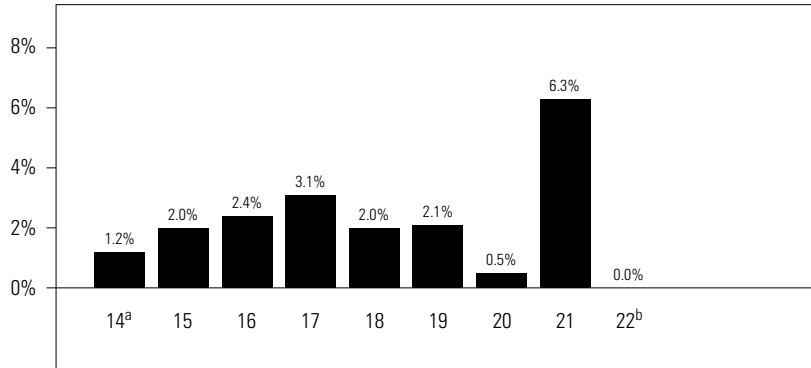

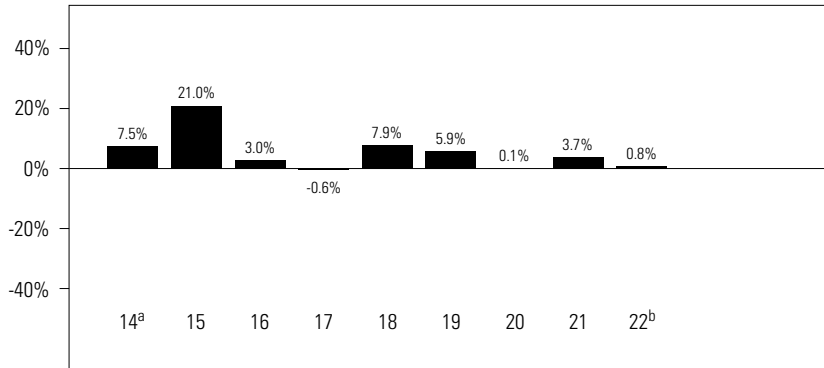
Class H Units

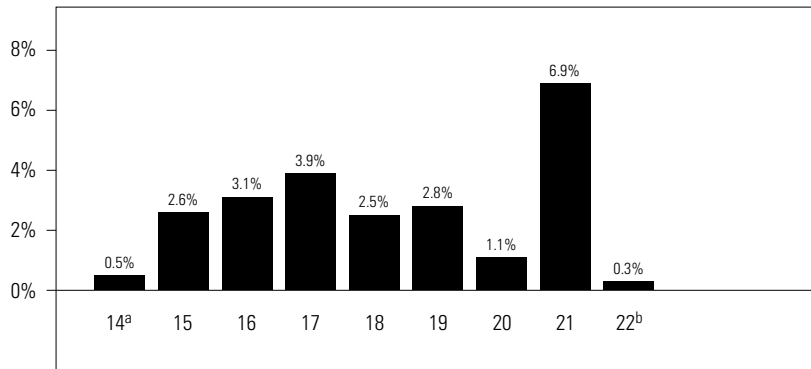
Premium Class Units

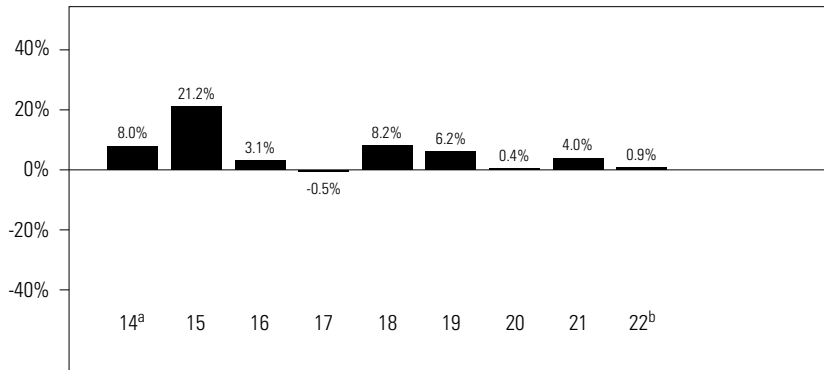

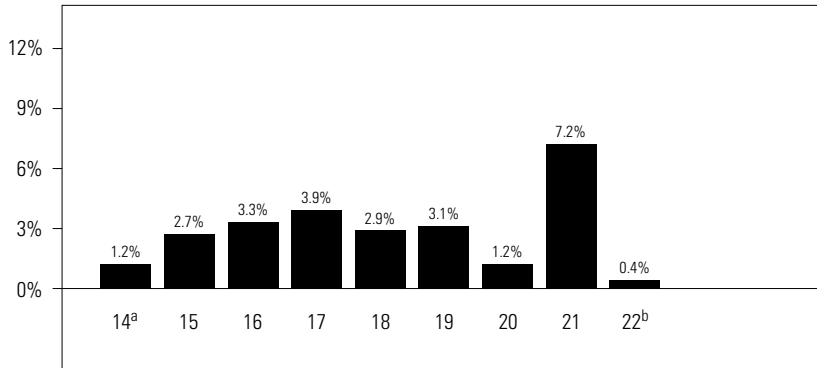
Class F Units

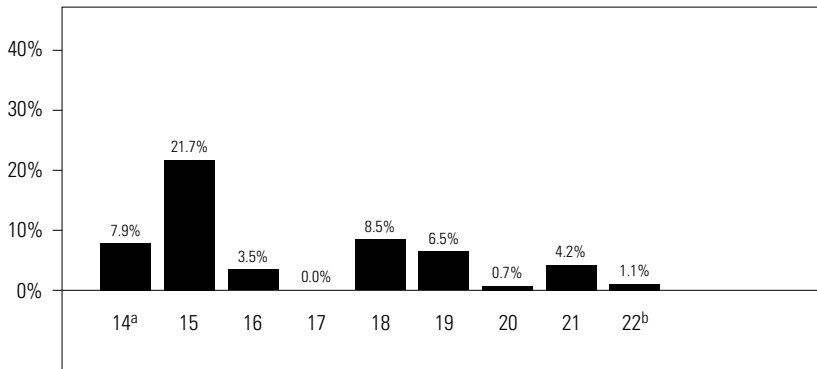
Class FH Units

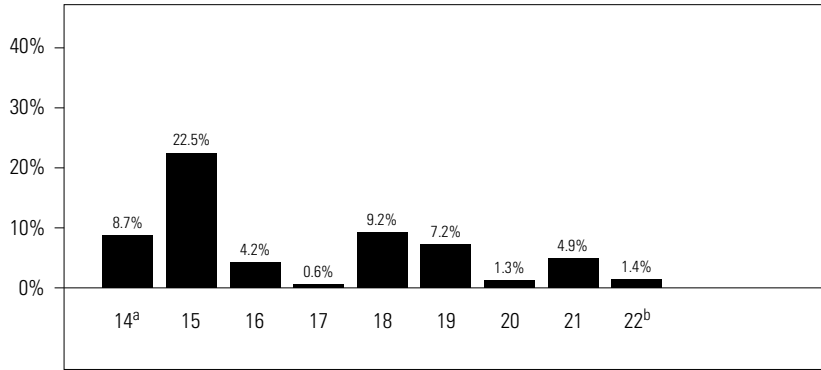

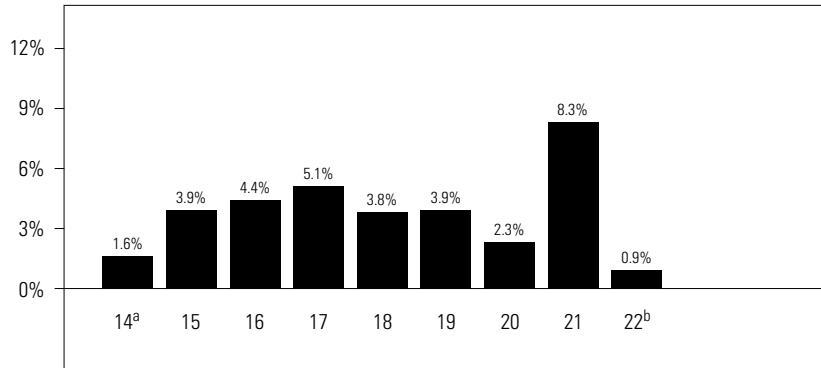
Class O Units
